1. From the library homepage at www.chaffey.edu/library, click on the link labeled **AGent**.

2. In the login box, type in your seven-digit Chaffey ID number in the first box, and your birth date in the second box using the format: two numbers for the month, two of the day, and the last two numbers of the

year, no spaces or dashes in between the numbers. Then click on the **My Account Login** button.

3. The link to **Opposing Viewpoints Resource Center** is located under **Current Issues & Controversies**. Click on to open the database.

4. There are two ways to search Opposing Viewpoints:

- there is a browsable list of topics in alphabetical order in the right area of the page.



5. Results in Opposing Viewpoints are sorted by format type, accessible by tabs near the top of the page. The tab that is **yellow** is the format whose list is currently on the screen.

Reference- articles out of reference works (encyclopedias, almanacs, etc.)

Magazines- magazine articles

Academic Journals- Articles out of academic and scholarly journals

News- newspaper articles

Statistics- statistics, survey

Primary Documents- Congressional hearings, government documents

Multimedia- podcasts, images, audio files

Websites- websites related to the topic

6. To access the full-text of one of the articles on the tab lists, click on **Full-text with Graphics** under the information about the article.



7. To print, email or download a document click on the icon on the top of the full-text page of the document.
